The North Coast Labour Council is hosting a non-partisan All-Candidates Forum for declared candidates in the upcoming Prince Rupert Mayoral and City Council election.

The forum will be held on **Tuesday October 4, 2022** from 7:00-9:00 PM at Charles Hays Secondary School in the multipurpose room. Light refreshments will be provided during the break and at the start of the forum. Doors open at 6:30 PM.

All declared candidates are invited to attend and speak at the forum. Equal time will be provided for each declared candidate. Speaking order will be based on a random draw held at the start of the forum.

Community members can submit written questions that will be read by a moderator and each declared candidate will be provided with equal time to respond.
